

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

A. Conclusion

In conducting this research, the researchers aimed to determine the effect of using the Retelling Technique Using Legend Story method in improving the speaking skill of Tenth Grade students at MAN 1 Pandeglang. After conducting the study on the experimental and control classes as measures of student ability, it was found that the average score in the experimental class was 71.7, compared to the previous average score of 54.5 for the experimental class, indicating an increase of 16.7 in the experimental class. These results were also higher than the control class, with an average of 60.3 and a pre-test average of only 51.4. This indicates that the improvement in the control class was only 8.9 points. Therefore, the post-test results in the experimental class were 7.8 points higher than the post-test results in the control class. This result shows that the use of the Retelling Technique Using Legend Story method can improve the speaking skills of tenth-grade students at MAN 1 Pandeglang.

B. Suggestion

The current study, "The Influence of Retelling Technique Using Legend Story on Improving Students' Speaking Skills," has shed light on the potential benefits of employing the Retelling Technique to enhance students' speaking abilities.
