A. Result of Observation

1. Data Presentation

Here is data of observation activity which is taken from class XI IPA 2 SMAN Cahaya Madani Banten Boarding School. The data is presented on tables and some results are described next.

2. Finding

From the observation the writer found some data as follows:

- a. From the first component or data the writer found that students have some activities, they are: listen to the teachers' explanation about conditional sentence and doing the conditional sentence assignment, but there were students who still found difficulties in constructing conditional sentence.
- b. From the second component the writer found that the teacher had done their job very well. It is proved by the table of data learning process which shown that teacher have given motivation to the student to increase their ability in constructing conditional sentence. Give explanation and example about conditional sentence, answering students question when students are asking about conditional sentence, and help students to solve their problem when they found difficulties in constructing conditional sentence.

3. Analysis

From the data above, the writer has found that students have done that activities, which is listening to the teacher explanation about conditional sentence, it means that students learned by considerable effort to understand the material were taught whether they understand or not. The writer assumes that the effort to listen the teacher explanation was a nice try to recognize and understand about conditional sentence.

B. Data Description

The writer wants to analyze the data that have been collected from the result of students test. The samples of this test are 15 students from class XI IPA 2 SMAN Cahaya Madani Banten Boarding School. For the first, the researcher gives instruction to the students to construct 15 conditional sentences (five sentences in conditional sentence type 1, five sentences in conditional sentence type 2 and five sentences in conditional sentence type 3). And then the researcher made a table in order to know the result of students' written text. The researcher classified the test into three classifications:

The table above is a result of students' error in constructing conditional sentence, many students made mistakes not only in structure of each type of conditional sentence but also in written text aspect and the researcher more focus in three difficulties types of error such as grammar, verb and punctuation. Here is the result of percentage of students' error when the students construct conditional sentence:

a. Grammar

$$\frac{77}{100} \times 100 \% = 77 \%$$

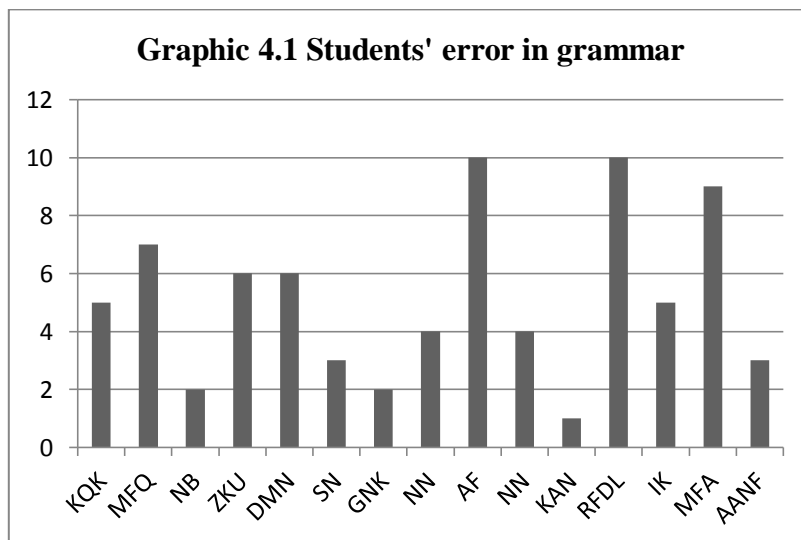
b. Verb

$$\frac{15}{100} \times 100 \% = 15 \%$$

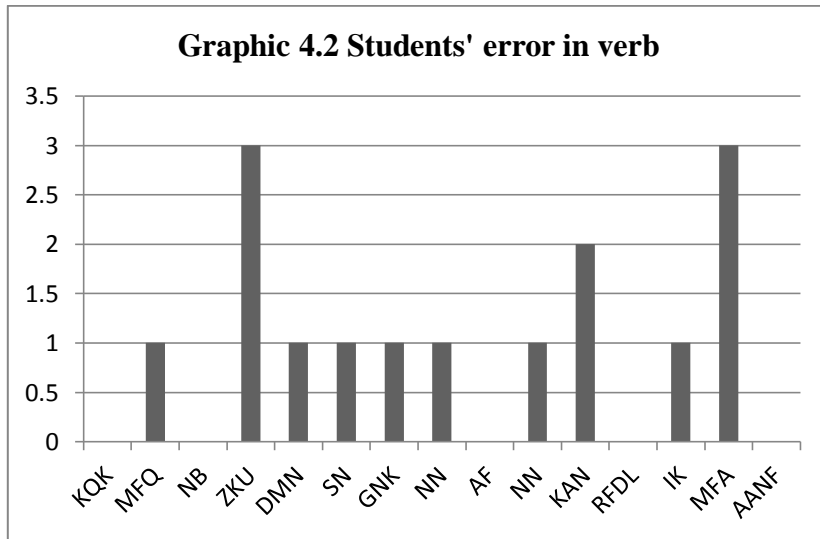
c. Punctuation

$$\frac{8}{100} \times 100 \% = 8 \%$$

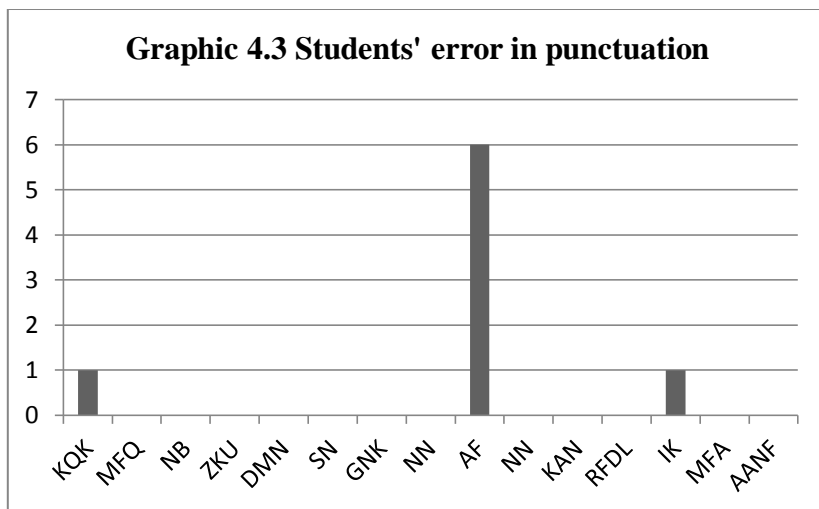
From that result above, the researcher can analyze that the students still confused in constructing conditional sentence and they have not mastered the pattern of each type in conditional sentence, although they have been taught about it before, they were still confused the use of verb in each conditional sentence.



The graphic above is a result of students' error in grammar. Majority of the students still made of this mistakes and two from fifteen students made it until ten wrongs.



The graphic above is a result of students' error in verb. Some of the students still made mistakes in verb and there are two students who made mistakes until three wrongs.



The graphic above is a result of students' error in punctuation. Three of fifteen students still made mistakes in punctuation and there is one student who made mistakes until six wrongs.

C. Data Analysis

1. Corpus Analysis

After collecting the data and identifying each students' error, the researcher would like to analyze the students' error in their construction of conditional sentence based on the types of their error, they are:

D. Data Interpretation

From the recapitulation of corpus, the researcher found that 1 student out of 15 students made 13,3 % of error, and 3 students out of 15 students made 20 % of errors. 1 student out of 15 students made 26,6 % of error, and 2 students out of 15 students made 33,3 % of errors. 1 student out of 15 students made 40 % of error, and 2 students out of 15 students made 46,6 % of errors. 1 student out of 15 students made 53,3 % of error. 1 student out of 15 students made 60 % of error. 1 student out of 15 students made 66 % of error. 1 student out of 15 students made 80 % of error. 1 student out of 15 students made 106,6 % of error.

From the data description, the researcher also found that almost all of the students still made errors in grammar or 77 % errors. Some students made errors in verb or 15 % errors. Some students made errors in punctuation or 8 % errors.

The writer found that some students have not known the use of tenses in each type of conditional sentence. They don't know kinds of verb that must be applied in each of conditional sentence. Students should have mastered the material tenses as a basis of learning conditional sentence.
